

Queen's Film Theatre accepts all major credit & debit cards. For screenings and events at The Belfast Barge, The Black Box, ODEON Cinemas, Ulster Museum, Accidental Theatre, Peter Froggatt Centre and Lyric Theatre a temporary Festival Box Office will be set-up for cash payments only. The temporary Box Office will be situated in the foyer of each venue and tickets will be available to purchase 1 hour before the relevant screening/event.
